The department seeks someone who can teach: SOSA 2181: Explaining Crime and Criminal Behavior, SOSA 2182: Exploring Crime and Criminal Behavior, SOSA 3281: Youth Crime; SOSA 3285: Sociology of Law and SOSA 3291: Corrections. Expertise and/or teaching experience in the areas mentioned above will be considered an asset.

Applicants should hold a PhD in Sociology (or related discipline) and have experience in university-level teaching.
