

Teaching Term Position in Sociology

The Social Cultural Studies Programme, School of Arts and Social Science invites applications for an 8-month teaching term position in Sociology at the rank of Lecturer or Visiting Assistant Professor, depending on the applicant's qualifications. The position will begin on September 1, 2018 and end on April 30, 2019.

The successful candidate will hold a Ph.D. in Sociology or will have completed a Master's degree in Sociology and be working towards a Ph.D. in Sociology or a related discipline. Recent post-secondary instructional experience in the specified subject areas is preferred. In the Fall semester, the successful candidate will be required to teach Introductory Sociology (Sociology 1000), as well as Classical Social Theory (Sociology 3150), and Methods of Social Research (Sociology 3040). In the winter semester the successful candidate will be required to teach Introductory Sociology (Sociology 1000), Social Movements (Sociology 3140), and Communities (Sociology/Anthropology 2200).

Applications will be accepted until 5:00 p.m. on Friday, May 18, 2018.
