The Munk School of Global Affairs and Public Policy in the Faculty of Arts and Science at the University of Toronto invites applications for a full-time tenure-stream appointment in the area of Migration Studies. The appointment will be at the rank of Associate Professor and will commence on July 1, 2019, or shortly thereafter. The appointment is contingent upon a successful tenure review. The successful candidate will also be eligible to be appointed as the newly established endowed Munk Chair in Immigration.

Applicants must have earned a PhD in any relevant field, including but not limited to: migration studies, political science, sociology, economics, law, anthropology, geography, or contemporary history. The School seeks a scholar with a strong background in migration studies. We are particularly interested in candidates who attend to issues of public policy in their teaching and research. Regional specialization is open, as is disciplinary background. Preference will be given to candidates whose research focuses on more than one country. A demonstrated exceptional record of excellence in research and teaching is required. We seek candidates whose research and teaching interests complement and strengthen our existing departmental strengths: <https://munkschool.utoronto.ca/>. Candidates should have an established international reputation based on a scholarly record of excellence appropriate to their career stage and will be expected to sustain and lead innovative and independent research at the highest international level and to maintain an outstanding, competitive, and externally funded research program.

Candidates must provide evidence of research excellence as demonstrated by a record of sustained high-impact contributions and publications in top-ranked and field-relevant journals, the submitted research statement, presentations at significant conferences, distinguished awards and accolades, and other noteworthy activities that contribute to the visibility and prominence of the discipline, as well as strong endorsements from referees of high standing.

Evidence of excellence in teaching will be demonstrated through teaching accomplishments, the teaching dossier submitted as part of the application including a strong teaching statement, sample course syllabi, teaching evaluations, graduate supervisions, as well as strong letters of reference. A demonstrated commitment to graduate education and mentorship are required. The successful candidate will teach full-time in the Master of Global Affairs and Master of Public Policy programs. Collaboration with colleagues in disciplinary departments of the University of Toronto is encouraged and the successful candidate may apply for a non-budgetary cross-appointment to their disciplinary department.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
