The Centre for Global Studies at Huron University College, in London, Ontario, invites applications from qualified persons interested in teaching one or both of the following upper-level one-term undergraduate courses (each valued at 0.5 course credits) over the fall term of 2019:

CGS 3515F - Global Cultures of Gendering and Orientation

This course examines how material and social orders of our world are organised in practices of gendering and the normalising of social and bodily orientations. Students will engage contemporary feminist and queer theory, practical deployments of gender and orientation globally, and problems of resistance pertinent to the politics of both.

CGS 3522F - Global Mobilities

This course examines how we may analyse human life, globally, as in movement and as different forms of mobilities, and how it is that social, political, economic, legal, and cultural orders in the world are conditioned, at fundamental levels, by efforts to manage, shape, objectify, and discipline movement.

(Wednesdays, 8:30 - 11:20am.)

It is expected that the instructors for these courses will build their pedagogical approaches by drawing freely from scholarly materials, problems, and assignments familiar across the range of the social sciences and humanities. The instructors hired to teach these courses are welcome to draw on their own creative resources and specific areas of scholarly research and expertise in creating their own versions of each. And, as with the teaching of all courses in the Centre for Global Studies, the instructors of these courses should be prepared to develop their pedagogical approaches in building the courses from fundamentally critical and interdisciplinary starting points, offering students serious intellectual challenge, deep engagement in the subject matters, and effective instruction in the development of scholarly skills and practices.

The academic backgrounds of applicants should be from the social sciences, humanities, or interdisciplinary programs. To be seriously considered for these positions, applicants should

either have already earned a PhD in their respective fields of study or currently be enrolled in a PhD program.

Applications for teaching the courses listed above should include the following: a letter of application in which the applicant explains per qualifications for teaching one or both of the courses and the approaches that per would like to take in teaching one or both; the applicant's current curriculum vitae; a list of at least two persons willing to offer academic references in support of the applicant's application; and a statement on the applicant's pedagogical outlooks and preferred methods of teaching and evaluation of students.
