The Department of Sociology at the University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, invites applications to fill a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor, to begin July 1, 2022, in classical and contemporary sociological theory.

The Department of Sociology offers both undergraduate and graduate (MA and PhD) programs and supports interdisciplinary collaborations in teaching and student supervisions. Faculty members hold a variety of theoretical and methodological positions and are active in engaging in applied policy, community-based, and social justice research.

The successful candidate must possess competency across a broad range of theoretical perspectives enabling them to teach our core undergraduate and graduate theory courses, currently offered at the lower level, upper level, and at the graduate level. The successful candidate will be invited to contribute to the development of the undergraduate and graduate curriculum by designing and piloting new courses.

The department encourages and welcomes applicants with a broad range of specializations, including, but not limited to, those that align with its areas of research and teaching specialization ([see here](#)). Applicants must hold a solid publication record and demonstrate potential for excellence in research and

teaching. A completed PhD in Sociology or a firm completion date prior to July 2022 are required to be considered in the selection process.

Applications requirements consist of a cover letter, an up-to-date curriculum vitae, a teaching portfolio, a sample of written work, and three letters of reference.
