

The Department of Sociology at Saint Mary's University invites applications for a full-time, tenure track position at the rank of Assistant Professor to commence July 1, 2022. While area of specialization is open, preference will be given to quantitative sociologists who show promise teaching Quantitative Research Methods and Introductory Sociology. Candidates must provide evidence of high quality and innovative teaching and scholarship. While preference will be given to candidates with a PhD in sociology, ABD candidates with a dissertation defense date scheduled may apply. Please note that only applicants with a PhD (or ABD) in sociology will be considered for this position. The deadline for applications is March 18, 2022.

Applications must include: 1) a cover letter; 2) a curriculum vitae; 3) a teaching dossier (including evidence of teaching effectiveness and course evaluations, if available); 4) a short research statement; 5) one example of recent peer reviewed, scholarly writing; 6) graduate transcripts; and 7) the names and contact information for three referees – only short-listed candidates will be asked to provide letters of reference.
