2 WHAT MAKES A GOOD RESUME?

- ✓ Specific to the job ad/company
- ✓ A strong summary statement that highlights relevant core competencies
- ✓ Minimal academic jargon
- ✓ Easy to skim with some white space
- ✓ Experiences with quantified outcomes
- ✓ Use of industry-specific language as noted in the job ad

3 TRANSLATING EXPERIENCES

Step 1: List your experiences, work responsibilities, and skills acquired

Step 2: "PAR" Resume Writing Method

P - problem, state an issue or work task

A - action, how you addressed the issue or task

R - results, what was the outcome
