The University of Victoria's Dept. of Sociology invites applications from talented scholars for a tenure-track position in the area of Sociology of Health at the rank of Assistant Professor to commence on 1 July 2027. We are especially interested in applicants with expertise in critical qualitative methods and health equity, as well as the demonstrated ability to teach in the area of the sociology of mental health. Applicants should have the ability to supervise graduate students working on a range of health-related topics.

The Dept. of Sociology at the University of Alberta invites expressions of interest for 8 month (T8 - Fall 2026; Winter 2027) and 12 month (T12 - Fall 2026, Winter 2027, and Spring/Summer 2027) full time term positions to commence on Sept. 1, 2026 with the possibility of renewal. Responsibilities for these positions include the teaching of 6 courses over an 8 month period (T8) or 8 courses over a 12 month period (T12). Preference will be given to candidates who can teach in one or more of the following areas: methods, criminology, social theory, inequality, and/or social problems.
