The **Department of Sociology** at the University of Alberta invites expressions of interest for 8 month (T8 - Fall 2026; Winter 2027) and 12 month (T12 - Fall 2026, Winter 2027, and Spring/Summer 2027) full time term positions to commence on September 1, 2026 with the possibility of renewal. Responsibilities for these positions include the teaching of 6 courses over an 8 month period (T8) or 8 courses over a 12 month period (T12). Preference will be given to candidates who can teach in one or more of the following areas: methods, criminology, social theory, inequality, and/or social problems.

A Ph.D. in Sociology or a related discipline at or near completion is required for this position. Applicants should be able to demonstrate excellence in teaching at the undergraduate level. Salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications in accordance with Academic Teaching Staff employment agreements.
