

The Department of Sociology in the Faculty of Arts & Science at the University of Toronto invites applications for a one-year full-time Contractually Limited Term Appointment (CLTA) in the field of Sociology. The appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream, with an anticipated start date of July 1, 2024 and an end date of June 30, 2025.

Candidates must have a PhD in Sociology by the time of appointment or shortly thereafter, or a Master's degree in Sociology at time of application alongside extensive teaching experience in a degree granting program (3+ years minimum) is required. We seek applications from individuals with demonstrated excellence in teaching both large lecture classes and smaller, discussion-based classes in sociology. The successful applicant will have strong skills in sociological research methods and prioritize the teaching of sociology as an empirically grounded social science. We seek candidates whose teaching interests complement and enhance our existing [departmental strengths](#).

The successful candidate will be expected to teach undergraduate classes in introductory sociology and other courses as needed in our curriculum and that match the candidate's areas of substantive expertise.

Evidence of excellence in teaching and commitment to excellent pedagogical inquiry will be demonstrated through teaching accomplishments, a teaching dossier (with required materials outlined below), awards and accolades, and presentations at significant conferences, as well as strong letters of reference from referees of high standing familiar with relevant aspects of the applicant's teaching.

Candidates are also expected to show evidence of a commitment to equity, diversity, inclusion (EDI), and the promotion of a respectful and collegial learning and working environment demonstrated through the application materials.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Application materials must include the following components: a cover letter outlining suitability to teach at the undergraduate level; a detailed current curriculum vitae; and a complete teaching dossier including a strong teaching statement, sample syllabi and course materials, and teaching evaluations. Candidates are therefore also asked to submit a 1-2 page statement of contributions to equity and diversity, which might cover topics such as (but not limited to): teaching that incorporates a focus on underrepresented communities, the development of inclusive pedagogies, or the mentoring of students from underrepresented groups.

Applicants must provide the name and contact information of three references. The University of Toronto's recruiting tool will automatically solicit and collect letters of reference from each referee the day after an application is submitted. Applicants remain responsible for ensuring that references submit recent letters (on letterhead, dated and signed) by the closing date. At least one reference letter must primarily address the candidate's teaching.
