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CLUSTER NEWS

Hello ITDS cluster members,

We would like to welcome you to the first issue of our biannual newsletter! Moving forward, we will be planning to release issues in both the Fall and Spring semesters, which will provide updates on cluster initiatives, details about the annual CSA conference, information about professional opportunities and resources related to digital sociology, and will also include personal announcements from our membership. We thank our Newsletter Committee, Molly-Gloria Patel and Salwa Khan, for their tremendous efforts to design and put together this issue.

On October 26, 2022, the ITDS cluster had the great opportunity to co-host a special panel on "Researching Digital Media Literacy in Canada" with both MediaSmarts and the Rogers Chair of Studies in Journalism and New Information Technology as part of Media Literacy Week. The well-attended panel featured four ITDS members (Andrey Kasimov, Milana Leskovac, Monica Pauls, and Jinman Zhang) who gave talks about their experiences conducting research in digital spaces. The overall goal was to share stories and help establish "communities of care for digital sociologists" through a discussion about the opportunities and challenges associated with common forms of research in the field. We will be continuing this conversation in a panel on "Doing Digital Sociology" at the upcoming CSA conference, organized and moderated by Samantha McAleese and Kara Brisson-Boivin from MediaSmarts.

In terms of cluster initiatives, we are pleased to announce that we are currently accepting submissions for the second annual ITDS Student Paper Award. The competition is open to authors who are currently enrolled as graduate students with CSA memberships in good standing. The deadline to nominate (or self-nominate) a paper is March 31. This year we are also launching a mentoring program to pair together faculty and students who work at the intersections of technology and society. The objective is to help foster connections between established and junior scholars to discuss like-minded interests in research and teaching, and to provide advice and other support. We will be encouraging and facilitating meetings between mentors and mentees at the CSA conference. Please be on the lookout for our email in the coming weeks that will contain sign-up sheets for both roles.
