KEY DIFFERENCES

CV

- 1. Academic-oriented
- 2. List-oriented
- 3. Focus on research experiences
- 4. Long (no page limit)
- 5. Template (standard)

Resume

- 1. Industry-oriented
- 2. Explanatory
- 3.Focus on work experience
- 4. Concise (1-2 pages)
- 5.Customized

TRANSLATING EXPERIENCES

Step 1: List your experiences, work responsibilities, and skills acquired

Step 2: "PAR" Resume Writing Method

- P problem, state an issue or work task
- A action, how you addressed the issue or task
- R results, what was the outcome

WHAT MAKES A GOOD RESUME?

- ✓ Specific to the job ad/company
- ✓ A strong summary statement that highlights relevant core competencies
- 🖉 Minimal academic jargon
- \checkmark Easy to skim with some white space
- Experiences with quantified outcomes
- Use of industry-specific language as noted in the job ad
