The Writing Process

- Review the opportunity and note the criteria
- Structure a convincing argument
 - 1. What are you proposing?
 - 2. Why is this work relevant?
 - 3. How will you do it?
 - 4. What findings do you expect & why?
- ✓ Tailor your application to fit the unique call

Editing Tips

- 1. Find peers/professors/supervisors to review your work
- 2. Ask for critical feedback
- 3. Don't take edits personally
- 4. Avoid jargon and complex language
- 5. Use short and straightforward sentences
- 6. Be consistent with your tenses
- 7. Prepare for multiple drafts
- 8. Give yourself time and space to edit

Additional Wisdom

- Use your publications/research/ leadership experience to demonstrate your abilities
- → Ensure humility by situating personal accomplishments in teamwork
- → Find awards that fit your work
- Propose research that you are passionate about
- → Some awards, like the Trudeau
 Foundation Scholarships and Vanier
 Graduate Scholarships, expect
 leadership experience

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
